

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The BSc Construction Management degree programme offered at the NMMU (1)

 - Prepare construction managers to manage the business of construction and to pursue other careers such as construction project management
 - Register with the SACPCMP

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The BSc Construction Management degree programme offered at the NMMU (2)

- Treatise of 12 000 15 000 words
- Solo endeavour unlike other universities
- Endeavour to publish conference, or even better, journal papers therefrom

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Plagiarism

• What is plagiarism?

- Unintentionally using someone else's work without acknowledgement
- Deliberately pretending someone else's work is your own
- Nelson Mandela University's rules with respect to plagiarism:
 - The prospectus refers to plagiarism as misconduct: "Commits an act of plagiarism, including the copying of another student's assignment, or copyright infringement."
 - 0% will be awarded
 - Disciplinary hearing with plagiarism offence can lead to:

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Combating plagiarism

- No internet references
- No Wikipedia
- Monitoring:
 - Scanning for:
 - 'Familiar' paragraphs and sentences
 - American 'z' or spelling such as labor
 - Using Google
 - Using sophisticated plagiarism software such as Turnitin
